Abstract

Mobilizing sport for development and peace (SDP) is an emerging social trend that requires the support of a variety of funding agencies. Yet, little is known about the long standing ideas, traditions and practices that have built significant SDP 'historical and cultural baggage' (Darnell and Hayhurst, 2011, p.185) that may affect funding decisions.
