Metro: From Terminal 1, 2, 3 & 4 to Cuzco Metro (nearest Metro station to hotel)

- 1) Take the Metro exit at the Airport T1, T2 or T3 then take Line 8, direction to Nuevos Ministerios.
- 2) Get off at Nuevos Ministerios and transfer to Line 10, direction to Tres Olivos.
- 3) Destination arrival: Cuzco and take the exit: impares.
- 4) To go to the Hotel Senator, follow the map shown.





Must - see attractions

Gran Via: The most famous street of Madrid and has an exciting atmosphere 24/7. Commonly known as the "Spanish Broadway" and shopping centre where you can find many theatres, cinemas and shops.

Its most outstanding landmarks include the Metrópolis, Telefónica and Carrión buildings.

Puerta del Sol square: Look for the 'Kilometre O' plaque on the ground, which is the centre of the Peninsula then take a photo with the Bear and Tree Strawberry monument and the statue of Charles III. The clock at Casa de Correos always rings in the New Year.

Plaza Mayor: One the largest squares in Europe and hosts some of greatest bars and restaurants in Madrid. The Plazas vibrant atmosphere and its traditional architecture is a must see! Also you must eat a "bocadillo de calamares" around the square.



Must-see attractions

Royal Palace: Home to the Kings of Spain from Charles III to Alfonso XIII, Madrid's Royal Palace takes us on a journey through the history of Spain. Though it is no longer the royal family's home, it continues to be their official residence.

Temple of Debod: Egyptian temple dating back to the 2nd century BC, transported to Madrid's Cuartel de la Montaña Park. The temple was donated to Spain by the Egyptian government to save it from floods following the construction of the great Aswan Dam.

Cibeles Fountain: Created in 1782 and situated in its current location since 1895. It has also become a symbol of the capital. The Fountain depicts the Roman goddess of the same name (Cybele in English), symbol of the Earth, agriculture, and fertility, atop a chariot drawn by lions.







Must - see attractions

La Puerta de Alcalá: The "Alcalá Gate" several meters away from the main entrance to the Buen Retiro Park. The Gate was a real door to enter in the city and was erected as a triumphal arch to celebrate the arrival of the King Charles III in Madrid.

Buen Retiro Park: A trip to Madrid is not complete without a walk through Retiro Park, the green lungs of the city. Madrid's largest parks and features cultural, leisure, and sport activities to all people. Rowing a boat on the lake is a must!

El Rastro: is a market held every Sunday in Madrid between 9am and 2pm. A great chance to explore a market from hundreds of different sellers with many Spanish specialties.







Golden Triangle of Art: Museums

Prado Museum: One of the most famous art galleries in the world, boasting the finest collection of Spanish paintings by Goya, Velazquez and El Greco.

The collection currently comprises around 7,600 paintings and thousands of other works of art and historic documents, prints and sculptures.

Reina Sofía Museum: Picasso's Guernica is the jewel in the crown of this museum specialising in contemporary art, where Spanish artists take pride of place. This is a chance to see works of art from the late 19th century to the present day (don't miss the works by Dalí and Miró).

Museo Thyssen – Bornemisza: A journey through the last seven centuries of European art, from the early 13th to the late 20th century. Dürer, Frans Hals, Gauguin, Van Gogh and Kirchner are just some of the great masters on display in the Villahermosa Palace.





Gastronomy

Chocolate con Churros: Cylindrical doughnuts made of deep-fried flour, are typically eaten dipped in hot chocolate. You'll find them at street stalls and cafés, and they also make a great late after - noon snack.

San Ginés: Pasadizo de San Ginés, 5

Jamón Serrano: Since antiquity Spaniards have produced dry-cured hams. You can eat it alone, with tomato and a toast with melon (typical dish), with eggs and fries.

Museo del Jamón : Carrera de S. Jerónimo, 6 Plaza Mayor, 18
Calle Mayor, 7 Calle Gran Vía, 72

Bocadillo de Calamares: Consists of a fresh bread roll filled with squid rings that have been coated in flour and deep-fried in olive oil. Madrileños usually wash down their *bocadillo de calamares* with a small beer.

El Brillante: Plaza del Emperador Carlos V, 8

Cocido Madrileño: A culinary symbol of Madrid. It's a two-for-one: the first course is a noodle soup and the second is stewed meat, bacon, chickpeas and other ingredients that vary depending on individual preference, such as carrots, turnips, cabbage, potatoes, morcilla (blood sausage) and chorizo sausage. **Cruz Blanca Vallecas: Martín Álvarez, 58**









Gastronomy



Plaza San Miguel, s/n 28005

San Miguel Market opened in May 1916 as a food market and became Madrid's first gastronomy market in May 2009.

Market is the city's gastronomic temple, the contemporary essence of all the corners of Spanish cuisine. From the best Iberian ham, fresh seafood brought from Galicia to Mediterranean rice and cheese from Castile, Asturias or the Basque Country. The finest products and wine from 30 permanent stands.

In spring, <u>Madrid</u>'s parks, gardens and green spaces are bursting with flowers. From the month of May, the weather becomes almost summery, with average temperatures reaching 21°C (70°F).

SCHEDULE OF PUBLIC TRANSPORT

METRO

Open daily from 6:00 a.m. to 1:30 a.m, although some stations have limited opening times.

Service frequency depends on the line, time and day of the week, between 2 to 5 minutes in peak hour and 15 minutes on evenings.

MADRID CITY BUSES: EMT

Operate daily from 6:00 a.m. to 11:45 p.m. Service frequency depends on the time of the day and the bus route, between 5 and 8 minutes.

From 11:45 p.m. through the whole night, a network of 25 night bus lines comes into operation during the night of all days of the week while the underground system is closed.


