Please, briefly describe your experience, skills and competences (if any) in the following areas that you consider useful for a position in the EASM Board.		
Current & previous EASM involvement:	Since the EASM conference in Torino in 2007, I have been involved as a participant in eight other EASM conferences in which I frequently presented research papers. Therefore, I have an excellent good knowledge of the conference and the expectations of its participants. I am well connected amongst the EASM community and have been developing cooperation on both research and education with many sports management specialists, programmes and universities across Europe.	
Strategic management & leadership:	From a professional perspective, I am leading the UEFA Academy team and am ultimately in charge of the strategy of the business school and its development. At an academic level, I have been teaching	



	"strategic management applied to sports organisations" at the University of Lausanne over three years (2 hours per week over a Semester) and have been doing research on this topic.
Learning & teaching:	I am a qualified learning and development professional. I am part of the "Chief Learning Officer Circle" of IMD Business School and regularly attend programmes and conferences on this topic. I am used to give lectures and presentations on various topics for students of various levels (bachelor, master, MBA and vocational education).
Research & scholarly activity:	I have publications in academic journals and edited books, mostly on the impacts of sports events on their hosting territories. I have also performed several cost-benefit analyses. I was a teaching and research assistant at the University of Lausanne and was a lecturer for three years for masters' students.
Practitioner & sport industry experience:	I have been working for over fifteen years at UEFA where I created the UEFA Academy which can be described as "the business school of UEFA". We deliver 20+ personal development programmes for professionals working in the football/sports industry. Prior to joining UEFA, I had mostly an academic career in parallel to practising sports journalism for various media in Switzerland.
Internationalisation:	In my job at UEFA, I am in daily contact with a vast international network of contacts and stakeholders in sport. The UEFA Academy is delivering programmes all over the globe (not only in Europe) and I am spending more nights abroad than at home (not sure it is a good thing!).



Marketing:	I have good understanding of the main marketing techniques and a strong interest for this field. It is however not my area of specialisation.
Project management:	I have some good knowledge of the main principles of project management and of the recent evolutions in this field. I have been a project leader on various projects.
Finance & accounting:	I am in charge of the budget of the UEFA Academy. I am an economist by training (master's level).
Legal:	This is not my core area of competency although the UEFA Academy delivers various programmes and lectures dedicated to sports law.
Additional personal statement:	I have always considered sound academic research as being of critical importance to inform the decisions of sports organisations. As an EASM Board member, I would like to contribute to bridging the gap between the academics working in sport management and the sports organisations. I am extremely well- connected in international sports organisations and in European football both at an international and national level. I believe EASM has a potential to grow and to become more impactful in developing further relations with sports practitioners and their organisations.
